York Student Cinema welcomes everyone to our screenings.


## ACCESSIBILITY

YSC can be found in P/X/001, which is in the Physics and Electronics Department on the main campus, at the south end, by the Student Centre.





# **The Lego Movie (PG)**


**Directors: Phil Lord, Christopher Miller**



# Inside Llewyn Davis (15)

Directors: Joel Coen, Ethan Coen

Joel and Ethan Coen strike again. Unfortunately largely overlooked by the Academy at the Oscars this year, this film may be one of the filmmaker brothers' best, and certainly one of the best films of 2013. Following a young folk singer as he tries to make it in the competitive Greenwich Village folk scene of 1961, *Inside Llewyn Davis* is a visual and musical pleasure. While it does not romanticise the time it is set in (making it all the more convincing), it is still beautiful and heartfelt. With its great musical numbers, including the folk ballad "Fare Thee Well (Dink's song)" performed by Marcus Mumford and Oscar Isaac for the film, and great acting, this is a must-see. Labelled 'the greatest art heist in history', *The Monuments Men* tells the true story of an unlikely World War II platoon made up of museum directors, curators and art historians who had the tricky task of entering Germany in order to rescue artwork from Nazi thieves. It was a challenging assignment for the men, who were more used to spending their time in art galleries and museums rather than an active warzone, but, if successful, their mission could not only save important pieces of art, but also help prevent the destruction of 1000 years of culture by the Nazis. George Clooney is in the director's seat of this WWII epic, and he does a great job, with a stellar cast, of bringing a relatively unknown story of the war back to life. - **MC**

# 300: Rise of an Empire (15)

The pre-side-sequel (if that's even a thing) to the epic film *300*, *300: Rise of an Empire* follows Themistocles (Sullivan Stapleton), the Greek general, who wages war on Artemisia (Eva Green), leader of the Persian navy, as she, together with the mortal-turned-god Xerxes (Rodrigo Santoro), attempts to take over the whole of Greece. Although there is no awesome kicking and screaming of "This is Sparta!", there are still plenty of beautifully executed (pun intended) battles and fights, and, of course, blood galore. A thoroughly enjoyable and entertaining romp through 'Greek History' and not a film to be missed. 


